

NOUN

A noun is a word for a person, place, or thing.

Examples

Proper nouns are the names of people or places like:

Gbarnga




Ellen Johnson Sirleaf

They should be capitalized.

VERB

A verb is a word that describes an action.

Examples

Auxiliary, linking, or helping verbs work with regular verbs to complete a thought:




I *am* speaking and he *is* listening.

They *have* studied all of their notes.

ADJECTIVE

An adjective is a word that gives information about a noun.

Examples

Comparative and superlative suffixes added to adjectives are used to show differences between two or more nouns:

small

smaller

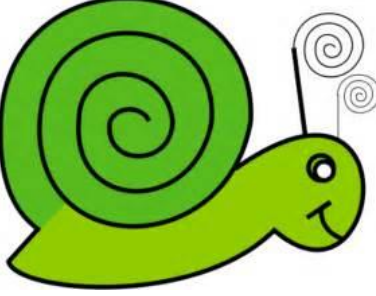


smallest

ADVERB

An adverb is a word that gives information about a verb, adjective, or other adverb.

Examples

Very is a very popular adverb that can be used to modify both adjectives and adverbs:

He is very slow. He walks very slowly.

PRONOUN

A pronoun is a word that is used in place of or as a substitute for a noun.

Types of pronouns

| Person | Subjective | Objective | Possessive | Reflexive |
|-----------------------------|------------|-----------|-------------|-----------|
| 1 st singular | I | me | my, mine | myself |
| 2 nd singular | you | you | your, yours | yourself |

| | | | | |
|-----------------------------|-------------|-----------------|------------------------|-----------------------------|
| 3 rd singular | he, she, it | him, her, it | his, her, hers, its | himself, herself, itself |
| 1 st plural | we | us | our, ours | ourselves |
| 3 rd plural | they | them | their, theirs | themselves |

Example

Instead of saying “Prince writes a letter to Konah” we can say “He writes a letter to her.”




PREPOSITION

N

A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between one thing and another.

Examples
